

## **Items that can be supplied with IMDG DGL data**

### **Segregation**

- Membership of segregation groups – highlight if the DGL entry belongs to one or more of the segregation groups in 3.1.4.4
- Segregation requirements in column 16 including:
  - Segregation required from segregation groups
  - "Segregation as for" class
  - Specific class segregation requirement

### **Stowage**

General stowage requirements for the class, subrisk, packing group, etc. from chapter 7.1 for both cargo and passenger ships

### **General**

- Numeric flashpoint values – as provided in column 2 (eg UN 3013) or column 17 of the DGL. Either as a set figure or as a range (eg UN 1234, UN 1272)
- Labels, placards and marks – supplied as data fields eg "3, 6.1", "None", "Hot" with images supplied separately for low resolutions screen display (not for full-size printing)
- Technical names – whether always required (e.g. with SP 274), only if declared as a marine pollutant (see paragraph 3.1.2.9), or never
- High consequence goods – identify each entry in the DGL as whether belonging to high consequence dangerous goods category as per 1.4.3
- State - solid/liquid/gas/explosive substance/explosive article
- Organic peroxide and self-reactives tables (chapters 2.4.and 2.5)
- P200 pressure receptacles table
- T50 non-refrigerated gas table
- Text for items notated in the DGL
- Packing, IBC and tank instructions
- Packing provisions (also free format)
- Text of special provisions (also free format)

The above can be supplied in HTML or fixed format 80-column lines. Some is also available as free format text (e.g. Access memo fields)

### **Other modal regulatory data**

- ADR data from the dangerous goods list - Integrated with other modal data or separate
- 49 CFR data from the hazmat 101 table - Integrated with other modal data or separate
- Language provision
- Proper shipping names in French, Spanish, German, Danish, Swedish (the latter three are not official IMDG languages)
- Substance indexes in French and Spanish
- Other languages – please request
- Emergency response information
- EmS Schedules
- Emergency Action Codes
- Hazard Identification Numbers
